Cattle Camp (McCloud Falls area, Shasta Trinity National Forest)

Shasta County:

PG&E Campground near Cassel and Baum Lake Bureau of land Management Pit River Campground near Fall River MacArthur-Burney Falls State Park

Other good choices are PG&E campgrounds, and BLM campgrounds. Alas, it's difficult to get information on either. PG&E tends to provide really good wheelchair accessibility. BLM campgrounds are generally wheelchair friendly, but not ADA.
